United States Marine Corps Military Mentor

Capt. Karl J. Watje was born in Seoul, South Korea and adopted to an American family in Bloomington, Minnesota. He attended high school at Bethany Academy located in Bloomington and filled his time playing basketball and baseball. Capt. Watje was a part of the National Honor Society, and a part of the school senate. He received two scholarships from and attended the University of Northwestern (UNW) in Saint Paul, Minnesota. He also volunteered at a non-profit, Breaking Free, where he mentored teenagers escaping human trafficking.

Upon returning from another deployment, Capt. Watje was selected by the Marine Corps to attend the Army Logistics University at Fort Lee, Virginia. After graduating, he volunteered to shift to Okinawa, Japan. He currently serves at the Jungle Warfare Training Center, as the Logistics Officer, and Jungle Survival Expert.

Capt. Watje has received specialized training in Evacuation Control, Joint Humanitarian Aid, Maritime Prepositioning Forces, Middle Eastern Regional and Cultural Studies, and Jungle Survival. His graduate education includes a Masters in Organizational Leadership from Brandman University. Capt. Watje has traveled and worked in Kyrgyzstan, Afghanistan, Kuwait, Egypt, Japan, and Brazil.

Capt. Watje's hobbies include exercising, reading, writing, musical theater, golfing, and scuba diving. He enjoys Star Wars, Lord of the Rings, and Harry Potter. He volunteers at Sunday Schools around Okinawa, the local library, and professionally writes for the United States Marine Corps.
